

2025 First Grade Coach's Report

The 2025 season was a successful and rewarding one for the Shamrocks Rugby Club, highlighted by a **Premiership win for our 2nd XV**. The First XV's campaign was driven by a talented group of young players who brought energy, commitment, and heart to the team.

Despite challenges throughout the year, most notably injuries and player unavailability, the season was deeply fulfilling from a coaching perspective. 2025 Juniors' Report

Shamrocks Juniors Relaunch

In September 2025 the Club commenced the relaunch of our Shamrocks Juniors, inviting Expressions of Interest for players to join Shamrocks Junior age group teams to play Rugby 7s. The call for junior players, coaches and volunteers was supported by updates to the Shamrocks Juniors webpage and a refresh of the Juniors social media profiles. An email broadcast was sent to current Club members, pamphlets sent to local schools and the age-old word of mouth worked quite well... Word quickly spread that Shamrocks Juniors were back!

The response was overwhelmingly positive, with over 100 players registering to play with Shamrocks Juniors teams in Illawarra Friday Night Junior Rugby 7s competition. Shamrocks entered 9 junior teams in total, with more boys teams than any other Club in the Illawarra District:

- 2 x U9s boys
- 2 x U11s boys
- 3 x U13s boys
- 1 x U15s boys
- 1 x U13s girls

Coaches and managers were successfully appointed for each team, with training held on Thursday nights. NSW Rugby Union helped with the first couple of training sessions by supplying qualified coaches to run drills and holding a girls only rugby camp at Ocean Park in the October School holidays.

Access Law Group continued its long and proud history of supporting the Club by signing up to be the Juniors new principal sponsor.

With such strong registration numbers, IDRUG Juniors asked Shamrocks Club to host the U13 and U15 Boys competition games every 2nd Friday night at Ocean Park, with the Thursday Crew stepping up with field set up and providing their usual amazing service across the BBQ, canteen and bar.

The Club ordered newly designed Junior jerseys, and shorts and socks were provided free of charge to all registered players. It was great to see so many ex-Shamrocks players becoming involved with their own kids, and strong support from the current Shamrocks senior playing group in coaching and general assistance (Finn Keifer, Lucas Leonard, Lachie Cauduro in particular).

It is hoped that the strong interest in the Friday Night Rugby 7s competition will be a great launching pad for Shamrocks Juniors teams to return to the Illawarra competition in 2026, with the goal of fielding up to 5 junior teams.



A massive thank you to Shamrocks Club stalwarts Mark Dandridge and Andrew Cracknel for all their additional hours and efforts to help get the Juniors back up and running. We are looking forward to the Shamrocks Juniors becoming the #PrideoftheNorth once again in 2026 and beyond.






2025 Treasurer's Report

Another tough year financially for the Club as Canteen revenue dropped again year on year and our Sponsorship revenue was also down considerably on 2024 revenue.

We continued our player registration fee reimbursement initiative, which was greatly appreciated amongst the playing group, unfortunately however, we did not recover a good proportion of this expense through individual supporters of player fees as happened in 2024. Therefore, if we are to continue with this initiative in 2026, we will really need to work on having supporters and businesses providing a good percentage of this cost through their sponsorship of the players.

Canteen revenue was down due to a combination of factors despite the tremendous efforts of Michael, Denise, Kenny, Anne and all those volunteers that helped each home game to make these days a success.

The main contributing factors here were the lack of getting a home trial game away at the start of the year, less sides in the 1st Grade competition meant we had one less home game and a home game with only one grade playing. Also, this year we were unsuccessful in hosting a semi-final game at Ocean Park which was the first time this has happened in many years. We have enjoyed a great run of being successful with our tender bids for these games and they had always proved profitable for our Club.

As a result, this year the Club has achieved an Operating Deficit of **\$10,087**, to compound last year's operating deficit of **\$18,761**. This deficit is understated, as we have not expensed the Presentation Night costs in the 2025 year as the Presentation night was held later this year than last year, so this expense will appear in the 2026 financial reporting result.

Our total retained earnings now stand at \$120,500 compared to last year's figure of \$131,083, which was down from the 2023 figure of \$149,844.

On a positive note, however we had some significant investment costs in our Juniors Relaunch Project with player strips costs of \$5,879 expended to give our 7's sides a fresh new look with their playing strips and that has been hugely successful. There has been other marketing and associated costs involved in the Juniors Relaunch Project and that has been money well spent, as it is an investment in our future.

A huge thank you to Jono Wheaton for his tremendous and tireless efforts in making the 7's tournament the success it is turning out to be for our Club, and this will hopefully translate into having Juniors sides back on the paddock in 2026 for us.

Building maintenance and equipment purchases costs were down year on year as we had invested significantly on these in the 2024 year.



A big thank you again goes to our main sponsors for this year, Tom with Access Law Group, Garry with Bellambi Bowling Club and Andrew Webb Accounting & Financial, as well as Troy and Michelle at Ray White Woonona. Their continued support has been significant over the years, so please support these businesses when you can.

This year saw Resin Brewery coming on board as well as a major sponsor for us and this relationship really built well over the 2025 season with the club having a couple of functions at Resin. Having their draft beer on tap at our home games was a huge bonus for us and there were quiet a few Shamrock Lagers or Ocean Park Pale Ales consumed every home game, so a huge thank you to Steve House and the staff at Resin for their support this year it has been greatly appreciated.

Thanks to all the volunteers involved in the Thursday crew, Canteen and BBQ again this year, this really underpins what the Shamrock culture is all about as we all get in and work to ensure the Club is successful and that the game day experience is the best it can be. Unfortunately, however the painting phobia continued this year in the Thursday crew, so I was left on my Pat Malone again with my paint brush in hand as the Clubhouse slowly but surely gets the fresh coats of paint it desperately needed.

Thanks, Terry for all your support with the financials, it is really appreciated.

To Paul, Ben, Lachie and all those that helped in the coaching and team management during the year a huge thank you. Through your tireless efforts you turned what could have been a disappointing year into one of great success for us, culminating in the 2nd Grade Premiership win which was a greatly deserved result for all your efforts.

We really do have the best Club culture and spirit in the Illawarra and you guys have been instrumental in ensuring that we continue to build and strengthen this culture.

The attached financials cover off in more detail the various expense related items, and revenue streams associated with the Club's activities this year. I will review these in more detail at our AGM.

Looking forward to another enjoyable and successful year of Rock's Rugby in 2026.



1. Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

The director(s) have prepared the financial statements of the company on the basis that the company is a non-reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements. The financial statements are therefore special purpose financial statements that have been prepared in order to meet the requirements of the constitution, the information needs of stakeholders and for the basis of preparation of the income tax return. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the significant accounting policies disclosed below, which the director(s) have determined are appropriate to meet the purposes of preparation. Such accounting policies are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise. The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs unless otherwise stated in the notes.

Income Tax

The income tax expense for the year comprises current income tax expense. The company does not apply deferred tax.

Current income tax expense charged to the profit or loss is the tax payable on taxable income calculated using applicable income tax rates enacted, or substantially enacted, as at the end of the reporting period. Current tax liabilities are therefore measured at the amounts expected to be paid to / recovered from the relevant taxation authority.

Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the company has a legal or constructive obligation resulting from past events, for which it is probable that there will be an outflow of economic benefits and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured using the best estimate available of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held on call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts.

2025 Canteen Report

The canteen remains the most important income generating tool for the club and while 2025 Food & Beverage sales were slightly higher for 2025, they still failed to come close to the record sales figures set in 2023 where, sales top the \$100K mark for the first time, still a respectful \$81,000 of sales was achieved. This would have been higher had we not had the wet weather impact on at least two home games and had the IDRUG shared the Final Series around the clubs more. Shamrocks missed out on securing any finals game in the 2025 series especially where the Shamrocks' Second Grade featured.

This effort was only made possible by the large number of volunteer hours willingly supplied during the season by our dedicated team of supporters provided the platform for such an achievement.

The detailed data on the following page provides an insight into the work our volunteers provide. The graph illustrates how wildly the work demands can fluctuate between games, depending on the weather and the visiting club.

The BBQ Gurus and Canteen Servers continue to provide a level of commitment unsurpassed in other Rugby Clubs across the Illawarra. The BBQ continues to set the standard for efficiency and skill. Terry Nutt and Mark Dandridge set up the day with terrific support from a host of volunteers; Al Potter, Steve Saywell, Mick Walsh, Grahame McDonald, Peter McAndrew, Rowan Allnutt, Vic Thicknesse, Grahame Tressider, Paul Griffiths, Mick Traynor, Mark Ziebell, John Sutherland, Darryl Sullivan, Joe Sproule, and others who offer a hand as needed on the day.

The Friday evening canteen takings continues to make a significant contribution to the year's food and beverage takings – a huge effort and Anne and Ken Phillis (as well as Mark and Terry who fill in when called upon), this effort continues to provide the solid foundation of canteen effort. The increase in Juniors' activities on Ocean Park will only increase that contribution.











Player Retention by Club in Illawarra Zone




